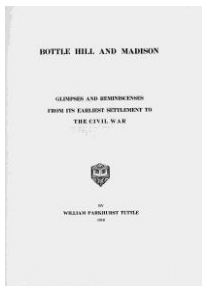

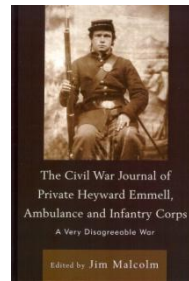

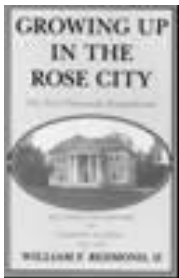

Heyward Emmell witnessed and recorded virtually all the major battles of the Army of the Potomac from the Peninsula Campaign to Gettysburg to the Siege of Petersburg. His journal, which has never been previously published, is the only known day-to-day eyewitness account of life as a stretcher bearer in the Ambulance Corps. It presents what he saw and in his own words – sometimes emotional, sometimes humorous, and always forthright.

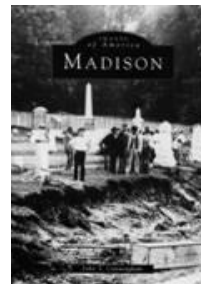

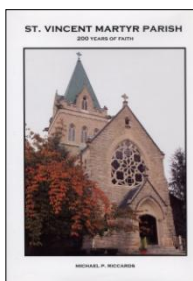

193-page hardcover, generously illustrated, with vignettes of life in the early 20<sup>th</sup> century in the Madison-Chatham area. 1984.

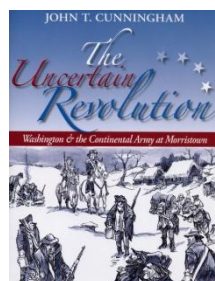

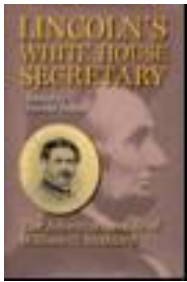

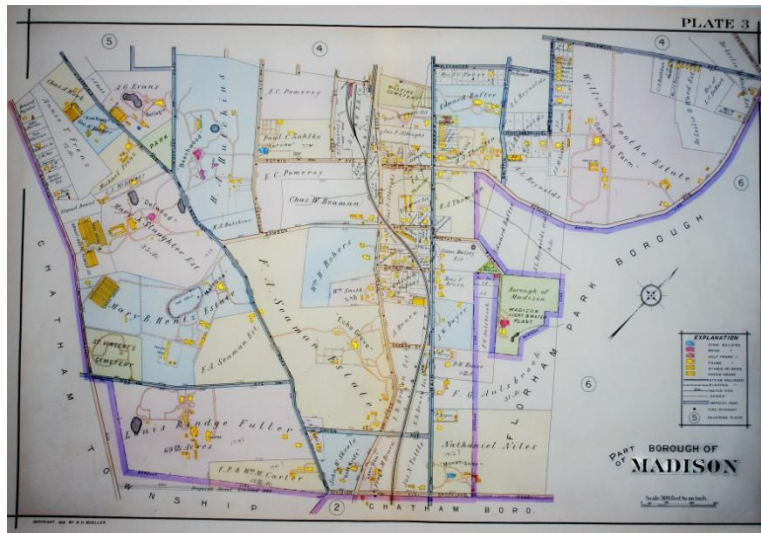
***FROM HERE TO HEAVEN*** by Thomas Sapio

*Map displays the eastern end of Madison to Greenwood and Alexander Avenues on the north side of Main St and to the Hillside Cemetery on the south side.*

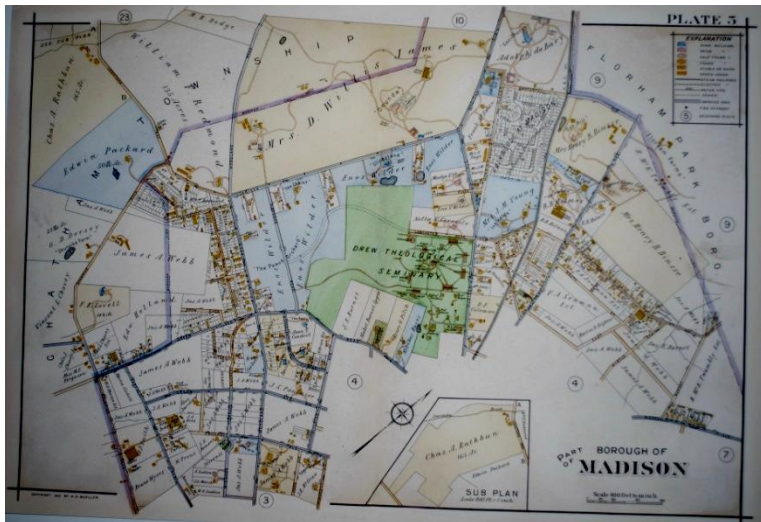
